NEW MANDATE FOR SIDE AIRBAGS

The National Highway Traffic Safety Administration has announced that all passenger vehicles must provide side impact protection by the model year 2013. Phase-in will start in 2010. Approximately half of 2008 models already offer this protection, including all Mustangs. Automakers are receptive to the mandates, and the cost will be low at approximately \$33 per vehicle. It is estimated that the mandate could save about 300 lives per year and reduce debilitating injuries by about 400 per year.

Since 2004, the Mustang has been the leading seller in convertibles, outselling other models by 2:1 or more. Approximately 25% of all Mustangs sold are convertibles, and the convertible is available in so many models, trim lines, and special editions, it has something to offer for everyone in every price range. Specialty editions include the California Special and Shelby GT500.

• Warriors in Pink special edition to commemorate the Susan G. Komen Breast Cancer Foundation. These cars will feature pink badging, pink rocker panel striping, and pink stitching on the seats and steering wheel.

WHAT "NOT TO DO" WHEN CAR SHOPPING

Since many people take advantage of end-of-the model-year closeouts to save big on a new car, CNNMoney offers advice on how to avoid major car buying mistakes:

1. Do not fall in love with one particular vehicle, especially a brand new model in order to be the first person with it (keep in mind these are financial people and not Mustang enthusiasts, so clearly they do not understand our enthusiasm).

2. Avoid taking long loans. Six years is too long, and there is the chance one could find themself "upside down" if there was to be a trade-in before the loan ends.

3. Negotiate the new vehicle purchase price first, then the tradein vehicle price.

4. Negotiate either over the phone or online since many dealers have personnel who do this exclusively. This avoids spending long hours in the dealership under duress. Get the final details in writing.

5. The outgoing model is often not a good deal if the new model is a substantial redesign. Your new car will automatically look old and dated. However, if you truly prefer the look of the old model, negotiate a good price on it.

MUSTANG AND FORD NEWS BRIEFS

• Ford reports August 2007 overall sales down 14% over last year. The top seller was the F-150 truck at 69,000 units. Ford will offer some \$1,000 cash back incentives on 2007 and 2008 models through October 1. Several financial analysts have tied slow auto sales to downturns in the housing market.

• Ford Mustang sales were 11,512 units in August, down 36% from August 2006. It looks like total model year production will be 99,537 vehicles, down 16% from 2006 when 118,928 Mustangs were sold.

• Ford is still trying to sell its Jaguar/Land Rover luxury brands, but volatility in the global economic market has stalled recent talks.

- The new Mustang men's cologne is now available through department stores which sell Estee Lauder's Aramis brand.
- A new Bullitt Mustang is supposedly planned for 2008.
- Grabber Orange will be a new special edition color on California Shelby GT's. Approximately 300 will be made.
- Classic Design Concepts is working on a retractable hardtop option for Mustangs. No word on price and availability date.
 A possible Mustang breakfast cereal may be available through Kellogg's.

• Look for Will Smith to drive a Shelby GT500 in his upcoming movie "I am Legend".

Hello friends!


