If you weren't there, than YOU WERE SQUARE, everyone present had a great time! We had 18 cars that joined us in the cruise up to Buchanan. Members from Hill City Cruisers and Star City Cruisers joined in on the fun.

Susan Davis, Board Chairman of the Theatre, told us how the museum was originally an 'Open Air' theatre in the early 1900's.

It was turned into an indoor theatre in 1919. The flood in 1985 completely drowned the theatre and put it out of business along with many others businesses in Buchanan. The locals loved their theatre so much that they formed a group to renovate their town jewel and bring it back to life. It re-opened in November 2002 with up to date video and sound equipment. While renovating, they found that when the doors closed on the theatre, nothing had been removed or cleaned up. Still in place was a movie on the film reel that had been showing just nights before. This original film and reel are located in the control room, close to where they were once the heart of the theatre. The 50's era popcorn machine was even renovated and is now being used. They tried to use and keep as much of the former theatre as possible during the renovation.

The Buchanan Theatre now shows movies each weekend. The cost is only \$4 or adults and \$2 for children. Concessions are only \$1.00 each! You can't find that in any other theatre. Our cruise-in was used as a promotion for their theatre. Many of the town's locals came out to see our rides and join in on the theatre
